

All laws of the State of Texas pertaining to public conduct apply. Additionally, Title 36, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 327, sets forth expected standards of park use. A portion of the code is below to review, but there are additional portions that apply even if not listed below.

1. Vehicles parked or used off authorized roadways are prohibited. (36 CFR 327.2)
2. Swimming, wading, snorkeling or scuba diving at one's own risk is permitted, except at launching sites, designated mooring points and public docks, or other areas so designated by the District Commander. (36 CFR 327.5a)
3. Camping is limited to 14 days in any 30-day period. (36 CFR 327.7b)
4. Diving, jumping or swinging from trees, bridges or other structures (cliff s) which cross or are adjacent to project waters is prohibited. (36 CFR 327.5c)
5. Keep park grounds free of litter; deposit trash in receptacles provided. (36 CFR 327.9a)
6. Rock fire rings or ground fires are prohibited. Fires must be confined to grills. (36 CFR 327.10b)
7. Pets must be kept on a leash not longer than six feet in length, at all times. No pets allowed on designated beaches. Pets may not be left unattended. (36 CFR 327.11a)
8. Persons shall be responsible for proper removal and disposal of any waste produced by animals. (36 CFR 327.11b)
9. Visitors must obey all posted signs and restrictions. (36 CFR 327.12)
10. Vehicles with visitor passes must leave the park by 10 pm closing time. (36 CFR 327.12a)
11. Radios or car stereos must be kept at a sound level that will not disturb other visitors. Quiet hours are from 10 pm to 6 am. These will be enforced. (36 CFR 327.12b)
12. The possession of loaded firearms, ammunitions, loaded projectile firing devices, bows and arrows, crossbows, or other weapons is prohibited. (36 CFR 327.13a)

13. Possession of explosives or explosive devices of any kind, including fireworks or other pyrotechnics is prohibited. (36 CFR 327.13b)
14. Cutting trees or limbs is prohibited. Gathering of dead wood on the ground for a fire is permitted. (36 CFR 327.14b)
15. Abandonment of property is illegal. (36 CFR 327.15)



Campsite Rules

- **CAMPING ONLY! NO DAY USE!**
- Madrone trail users must stay on trail not roads.
- Park Open: April 1 to September 30.
- Park gates open daily: 8 am to 10 pm.
 - Check-In 3 pm, Check-Out 2 pm
- Quiet time: 10 pm to 6 am
- Primitive Tent Site: \$12. Group Pavilions: \$75
- RVs are welcome, but must be self contained. No dump station available. No water or electric either.
- Maximum of 10 persons per single-use campsite. This includes all visitors.
- Maximum of two camping units per single-use campsite. Examples: (1 RV + 1 Tent) or (1 Trailer + 1 Tent) or (2 Tents).
- Vehicle Policy:
 - Vehicle = anything that requires parking space.
 - 2 vehicle maximum per campsite overnight.
 - 2 extra vehicles maximum per site: 8am- 10pm.
- Boat launching:
 - Available to paying campers that rent a site.
 - No one allowed in park to launch boats unless you are a paying guest renting a site.
 - Limit of 1 boat or jet-ski trailer per site limit.
 - NO 2nd boat or jet-ski trailer allowed.
- Drive-Thru Policy:
 - 10 Minutes Free
 - Daylight Hours Only (Mon-Thurs)
 - Restrictions: Fri-Sun, Holidays & during Peek Occupancy


