FLOATING PIPELINE NO WAKE

STAY 100' OFF WHITE MARKER BUOYS

NTMWD is dredging the water intake structure channels located on the south end of Lavon Lake using a hydraulic dredge. The pipeline that is removing the material is approximately 350 feet from the bank and runs from the western side of East Fork Park to the east side of East Fork Park, where it crosses the cove by East Fork Marina. The pipeline is marked with white marker buoys every 500 feet with orange marker buoys between, every 50 feet. The pipeline is floating or slightly submerged for the majority of the distance. It is submerged and open for vessels to cross at the East Fork Main Boat Ramp and in the middle of the cove entrance near the cove that supports the East Fork Marina Boat Ramp and East Fork Marina. The crossing areas is clearly marked with 36-inch red navigational buoys on one side and green navigational buoys on the other. In order to be able to clearly identify the permanent crossing locations, the red and green buoys have flashing red and green lights in accordance with their color. Vessels must stay 100 feet away from the pipeline and buoy markers. This is a "NO WAKE" area.
