

Hunting Permit Application Process – New Hunters to Lavon Lake

As of August 2021, hunting permits are no longer issued in person at the Lavon Lake office. In order to receive a hunting permit, you must download and submit the hunting application and waiver form below.

You can return the completed copy of the application and waiver with your Hunter Education certification info one of two ways:

1. Mail. Mail the hunting permit application waiver form, and Hunter Education certification to:

Applications that do not include a valid Hunter Education will be delayed until the applicant provides the information. If we cannot contact the applicant, the permit application and waiver will be destroyed.

Please note that every hunter must go through the permit application process. Hunting without a permit constitutes “hunting without the landowner’s consent” and is a violation of Federal and State laws, regulations, and policies. Violators will be prosecuted under Federal or State laws as applicable, to include the loss of hunting privileges for the remainder of the year.

Plan ahead. Permit applications will be processed in 5-10 business days. To ensure the permit is issued in a timely manner, please follow the directions outlined in #1 or #2 above.

Your 2025-2026 hunting permit will be emailed to you.

This liability statement allows entry upon lands owned by the U.S. Corps of Engineers for hunting. Permittee is not allowed to hunt until statement is signed. The Corps of Engineers does not know the proficiency of the other participating hunters, and the Corps specifically does not make any warranty or representation of any type, kind or character, whatsoever, as to existing conditions upon said lands for hunting purposes. Any person entering upon such lands enters at his or her own risk, impliedly accepts such lands in the existing conditions, and recognizes that all hunting is potentially dangerous because of the use of firearms/bows by hunters of varying degrees of proficiency, and in consideration of being permitted to participate in this public hunting program, I as parent or guardian of any accompanied minor, unconditionally release and hold harmless the Corps of Engineers against and for all liability, cost, expense, claims and damages for which the Corps might otherwise become liable by reason of any accidents, or injuries to or death of any persons, or damage to property or both, in any manner arising or resulting from, caused by, connected with or related to the presence of such person upon such lands and premises, regardless of how, where, or when such injury, death, or damage occurs even if caused by the negligence of the Corps of Engineers, its agents, servants, or employees, or due to conditions or operation on or defects in the premises. I, the Permittee, have read this release and understand all its terms. I execute it voluntarily with full knowledge of its significance.
