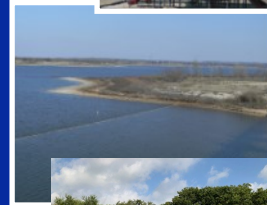

### Water Supply

- Water Supply to the Cities of Comanche, De Leon, Proctor, Hamilton, Gorman, and Dublin - Approximately 3 Million Gallons/Day
- Upper Leon Municipal Water District Draws Water From #2 Low Flow Outlet
