## Proctor Lake Hunting Policy

1. All hunters must comply with all Proctor Lake, Title 36 CFR 327 Rules and Regulations, State, and Federal hunting license/permit requirements.
2. Proctor Lake hunting permit is required to hunt within Sabana and Upper Leon Wildlife Management Areas. Hunting is NOT allowed in the Lower Leon River Area (below the dam).
3. Applicants must show proof of valid driver's License or State issued identification card and must be 17 years old or older. Applicants must show proof of hunter education or be exempt (born before Sept. 2, 1971).
4. Permitted hunters are allowed two (2) guests to accompany them while hunting. If guests are hunting. They must comply with all State and Federal requirements and must be within normal voice control of permit holder at all times.
5. Sharing of hunting permits and parking permits is NOT allowed.
6. All hunters and anyone accompanying the hunter on federal property MUST wear 400 square inches of daylight florescent orange with 144 square inches appearing on both chest and back, and daylight florescent orange headwear must be worn. Hunters are allowed to take off daylight florescent orange gear ONLY when actively hunting at a fixed location.
7. All hunting devices MUST be unloaded when transported to, from or between hunting sites.
8. Permitted hunting of feral hogs is allowed from February 1st through August 31st, two (2) hours before sunrise until two (2) hours after sunset.
9. Permitted hunting of small game (squirrel and rabbit) is allowed from February 1st through August 31<sup>st</sup>.
10. Parking allowed in designated areas by permit only. Parking permits are issued with hunting permit and must be displayed on dash of vehicle.
11. No motorized vehicles of any kind are allowed in the hunting areas.
12. Hunting or shooting is NOT allowed within 200 yards (600 feet) of homes, developed parks, roads, buildings, Government boundary lines, or other designated areas.
13. Rifles, Muzzle-loading rifles, or handguns are NOT allowed.
14. The use of archery and crossbows for the harvesting of feral hogs are allowed (refer to TPWD for guidelines).
15. The use of slugs for the harvesting of feral hogs is allowed.
16. Pack it in, Pack it out! All trash must be taken out including spent gun cartridges. Keep Texas Beautiful!
17. Only one blind per hunt is allowed.
18. Hunting blinds must be completely removed from the land or water upon completion of each hunting day. All blinds must have the hunter's name, date of installation, address, and phone number written legibly and placed at the entry point of the blind in a conspicuous location. If the hunter cannot be located and proper identification is not present, the structure may be impounded and/or removed.
19. The cutting of any vegetation to construct a blind is prohibited.
20. All harvested animals and parts thereof with exception to the entrails must be removed from Government land.
21. The use of dogs for chasing and capture is prohibited.
22. Trapping of any kind is NOT allowed.
23. Deer, Turkey, and Upland Game birds are NOT allowed to be harvested.
24. It is recommended to read the Fort Worth District Hunting Guide for any additional rules and regulations.
25. Failure to comply with all policies, rules, and regulations will result in the forfeiture of hunting privileges.
