PROMONTORY PARK.

Promontory Park provides an excellent venue to enjoy the outdoors. The park boasts stunning lake views and waterfront camping opportunities, all while providing easy access to some of the excellent outdoor recreation available at Proctor Lake.

Guests looking to soak up the sun or beat the heat will enjoy the swim beaches and picnic areas. Anglers will appreciate the excellent catfish, hybrid bass, black bass, and crappie fishing available along the shoreline, from the fishing piers, and on the lake itself. And boaters of all stripes will find the two boat ramps and nearby paved parking areas quite convenient.

When it comes to larger groups, Promontory Park stands more than ready to accommodate all manner of family reunions, fishing tournaments, and gettogethers at the four group shelters, three double sites, five screen shelters, and twenty-three picnic areas. Following the rules...

is common courtesy.

- 1. Camp only in designated sites.
- 2. Campsites will be rented exclusively to persons 18 years of age or older.
- 3. Only one camper trailer, self-contained pick-up camper, motor home, or tent is allowed per site, plus one additional tent. An additional campsite must be rented for excess camping equipment.
- 4. Only eight overnight guests per site.
- 5. Quiet hours run from 10pm to 6am. Entrance gates close during this period.
- 6. Two vehicles are allowed per site. Two more vehicles may park in overflow parking for a fee.
- Vehicles must be parked on prepared roads, turnouts, or parking areas. Off-road vehicles cannot be used in the park.
- 8. Follow all speed limits, maximum is 25 MPH.
- 9. Pets must be kept on leash no greater than six feet at all times.
- 10. "Keep Texas Beautiful"; pack it in, pack it out.

Park rangers enforce Title 36, Section 327, which can be found at the gate house or online. Violating regulations may result in a citation!
