PRIVACY ACT STATEMENT (5 USC 522a)

- 1. Authority: Section 4, Act of December 22, 1944, 54 Stat 899, as amended 16 USC 460d; Public Law 90–483, 82 Stat 746; and Public Law 92–347, 86 Stat 459.
- 2. Principal Purpose: To provide a request for and authorization of special primitive camping.
- 3. Routine Uses: This form is also used by the Project Office to permit camping outside developed public use areas. The form is also used to assist the Park Manager in locating the campers in case of an emergency.
- 4. Mandatory or Voluntary Disclosure and Effect on Individual NOT Providing Information: The disclosure is voluntary; however, a primitive camping permit cannot be issued without the information. Section 327.7, Part 327, Chapter III, Title 36, CFR prohibits camping except in areas designated by the District Engineer. The only areas designated for camping are developed public use areas and camping by permit only areas. Violators of Section 327.7 shall subject the violator to a citation and trail under the provision of Section 3401, Title 18, USC.

TEXAS PARKS AND WILDLIFE RULES FOR PRIMITIVE CAMPING <u>HUMAN WASTE</u>

Fortunately, nature has provided in the top 6 or 8 inches of soil a system of "biological disposers" that works to decompose organic material. Keeping this in mind, you should:

- 1. Carry with you a small digging tool. A light garden trowel is good.
- 2. Select a suitable screened spot at least 100 feet from any open water.
- 3. Dig a hole 8 to 10 inches in diameter, and no deeper than 6 to 8 inches to stay within the "biological disposer" soil layer. Keep the sod intact if possible.
- 4. After use, fill the hold with loose soil, and then tramp in the sod.
- 5. Nature will do the rest in a few days.
