The person whose name appears above is responsible for the compliance with all requirements listed below.

#### PERMIT CONDITIONS AND REQUIREMENTS

1. That the United States shall not be responsible for damages to property or injury to persons which may arise or be incident to the exercise of the privileges granted by this permit. The permittee will be responsible for taking all the precautions for the health and safety of the participants.
2. That the campsite shall be located in the area designated and on the dates specified.
3. That the campsite will be occupied by the permittee each day of the permitted period of stay. If the site is found unoccupied, the permit will be revoked.
4. That the permittee shall keep the camp area free of refuse, garbage, and trash at all times. Upon departure, the permittee shall remove all refuse, garbage, and trash from the area and dispose of it properly.
5. That the permittee will only gather dead material on the ground for firewood use.
6. That the maximum number of persons at each campsite shall be 8.
7. That the permittee and party shall comply with all provisions of Part 327, Chapter III, Title 36, CFR. (Copies are available at the Project Office.)
8. That the Park Manager reserves the right to revoke this permit at any time and require the permittee to remove his camp from the reservoir area.

**TEXAS PARKS AND WILDLIFE RULES FOR PRIMITIVE CAMPING**  
**HUMAN WASTE**

Fortunately, nature has provided in the top 6 or 8 inches of soil a system of “biological disposers” that works to decompose organic material. Keeping this in mind, you should:

1. Carry with you a small digging tool. A light garden trowel is good.
2. Select a suitable screened spot at least 100 feet from any open water.
3. Dig a hole 8 to 10 inches in diameter, and no deeper than 6 to 8 inches – to stay within the “biological disposer” soil layer. Keep the sod intact if possible.
4. After use, fill the hold with loose soil, and then tramp in the sod.
5. Nature will do the rest in a few days.
